2 sent to jail for making drugs without permit

SHE STABBED HUSBAND, HERSELF AND SET APARTMENT ON FIRE: COPPS Woman with stab wounds asphyxiates to death in burning flat in Ahmedabad

A WOMAN died of asphyxiation, allegedly after she inflicted stab wounds on herself after stabbing her husband as a fight turned violent in Ahmedabad Friday. The woman also set their apartment on fire Friday. The deceased woman was identified as Anita Baghel. Her husband Anil Baghel has sustained injuries and is in hospital, police added.

The couple have two children who were said to have been in school at the time of the incident. The Ahmedabad Rtd and Emergency Services (ARES) got a call around 10.15 am about an apartment in Eden V block of Godrej Garden City, on fire.

Following which she discussed the police line in the kitchen in order to kill herself which resulted in the fire. Both Anil and Anita did not have any burn injuries, said the police officer. According to the fire-junkies, neighbours called the 108 an ambulance and both the man and woman were shifted to Sola Civil Hospital. When the fire department came, nobody was inside the apartment. A resident of the block who lived on the ninth floor said that she and a few others tried to call the Baghels and tried opening the door, but they could not. "After some time, Anil Baghel opened the door. The whole apartment was filled with smoke. And Anil asked me to save his wife," the neighbour said. The couple's son studies in a school, his daughter is in Class 6.

To-be married couple in Vadodra abandons newborn, case lodged

WHEN WOMEN personnel of the Karambaga police station in Vadodra rescued an abandoned newborn baby from outside the Khawasod crematorium, little did they expect a twist in the tale. Right before the police arrived at SSC Hospital in the city with the baby, the child's parents—who were to be married Sunday—had already sought admission at the hospital for treatment.

Pieces of the puzzle fell into place, the police summoned the families of the couple. The couple, engaged for the last three years, were expecting their first baby. A police officer said, "The man and the woman are both aged about 24 years. They live in the neighbourhood. They were scared to inform their family members about the pregnancy and were planning to hide it until the wedding. On Thursday, as the woman went into labour, the fiance accompanied her to SSC Hospital but she delivered the baby on the way in the auto rickshaw and passed out. In a state of panic, the man abandoned the baby near a vehicle outside the Khawasod crematorium."

The officer said the families would accept the child being born to them. "As the woman began to have contractions over the past few days, she told her family that her decision was due to acidity. They claimed the woman managed to conceal the baby bump by wearing loose clothes. We are probing the case "the official said. Officials said the police would accept the bitter families to co-parent the couple and the child.
